Hello Team:

I can't believe it's September. What happened to summer? The Stone Soup Showdown was a ton of fun! Please see our photos. It seemed that everyone was excited about the idea of making this an annual event. Recently, our Stone Soup program was submitted for a Mutual of America Community Partnership award so please keep your fingers crossed. This would be a great honor for our agency.

Fall is almost here and soon we will hear the sounds of the Head Start kiddos having fun on our playgrounds. Head Start is a great program so if you know families with children aged 0 – 4, please spread the word that we have open slots for eligible children. A few fun facts about Head Start...

Early Head Start children show significantly better social-emotional, language, and cognitive development. Children who attend Early Head Start and transition to Head Start are more ready for kindergarten than children who do not attend Head Start. (Love et al., 2002)

Obese, overweight, or underweight children who participate in Head Start have a significantly healthier BMI by kindergarten. (Lumeng et al., 2015)

Children in Early Head Start are more likely to be immunized and have access to services for children with disabilities (Love et al., 2002).

Throughout K-12, mortality rates for 5- to 9-year-old children who had attended Head Start are 33% to 50% lower than the rates for comparable children who were not enrolled in Head Start. (<u>Ludwig and Miller, 2007</u>)

As adults, Head Start children have a higher likelihood of graduating high school, attending college, and receiving a post-secondary degree, license, or certification. (Bauer and Schanzenbach, 2016)

As adults, Head Start graduates are 19% less likely to smoke than their siblings who did not attend. The savings from these reduced health costs are equal to 36%-141% of the program costs. (Anderson et al., 2010)












EMPLOYEE OF THE MONTH Nicole Struble


